The site's Perl-driven design has also undergone a complete rewrite, reducing the website's loading time and data handling. Also a part of the redesign is the unique link-checking Verification Engine which runs once every day, testing all the links on the site, and turning them on or off according to daily availability on the web. This feature cuts down on the "404 Site Not Found" errors while using the MacPicks links.

The MacPicks link site's main competitor online has always been the venerable SiteLink Mac link website. Now that their site has reached an end, the MacPicks cordially invites all previous SiteLink users to visit the new MacPicks.
